Special effect makeup artist is the magician behind every movie characters' appearance.



Character: AR



Artistic (Creator) - occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs and patterns. They often require self-expression and the work can be done without following a clear set of rules.



Realistic (Do-Er) – occupations frequently involve work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They often deal with plants, animals, and real-world materials like wood, tools, and machinery. Many of the occupations require working outside, and do not involve a lot of paperwork or working closely with others.

Expertise

- Judgement and Decision Making —
 Considering the relative costs and benefits of potential actions to choose the most appropriate one.
- Coordination Adjusting actions in relation to others' actions.
- Monitoring Monitoring/Assessing performance of yourself, other individuals, or organizations to make improvements or take corrective action.
- Social Perceptiveness Being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.

Day-to-Day Tasks

- Apply makeup to enhance or alter the appearance of people appearing in productions such as movies.
- Attach prostheses to performers and apply makeup to create special features or effects, such as scars, aging, or illness.
- Select desired makeup shades from stock, or mix oil, grease, and coloring to achieve specific color effects
- Evaluate environmental characteristics, such as venue size and lighting plans, to determine makeup requirements.
- Create character drawings or models, based upon independent research, to augment period production files.

Work Setting

- Constantly having interaction with others.
- Continually spend their time using their hands to handle, control, or feel objects, tools, or controls.
- Steadily having close physical interaction with others.

Knowledge

- Fine Arts Knowledge of the theory and techniques required to compose, produce, and perform works of music, dance, visual arts, drama, and sculpture.
- Design Knowledge of design techniques, tools, and principles involved in production of precision technical plans, blueprints, drawings, and models.
- Customer and Personal Service Knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer and personal services. This includes customer needs assessment, meeting quality standards for services, and evaluation of customer satisfaction.
- Communications and Media Knowledge of media production, communication, and dissemination techniques and methods. This includes alternative ways to inform and entertain via written, oral, and visual media.
